CHAIR'S REPORT

Gianluca led prayer and land acknowledgement.

TREASURER REPORT:

- Phillip reported the January statement with paid-for coffee, pictures from the Christmas open house, and expenses for J. Flex.
- February statement shows no spending other than the monthly fee. The March statement has a balance of \$4243.18.
- Upcoming expenses are spelling bee \$125 (5x25 gift cards), agenda books, and bus for school wide mass.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

- Mr. Kwiecien updated us on the literacy, numeracy, and coding initiatives. The school will focus on high-impact strategies.
- Numeracy activities will shift to grades 2 and 5 to help prepare students for EQAO assessments in grades 3 and 6.
- The school funds were used to purchase 10 iPads and 20 Chromebooks.
- We discussed school pavement upgrades, late arrivals, and activities off campus.
- The "Grab and Go" nutrition program runs well, with money from the YMCA, Knights of Columbus, and parent donations.

TRUSTEE Report:

- Mr. Pascucci informed us about the declining enrollment in the GTA, including Dufferin Peel, with a slight increase in the last two years. According to the government, small schools must remain open
- The board is in a deficit position and is asking the government for additional funds to assist with the shortfall. The government has requested that the Board sell two closed schools to service debt.
- Graduation season is coming up.

PARISH Report:

- Passion plays a success at church, and Bishop Leo led mass "make the Bible the center of your life."
- Street Patrols will distribute sandwiches to Toronto's homeless.
- The OAPCE conference, featuring keynote speaker Steven Lecce, ensures that during tax season, parents are informed about directing our taxes to the English Catholic Separate system.
