During Catholic Education Week, students and staff will partake in various faith-based experiences including prayer, musical activities, artworks, and dramatic works. A school-wide liturgy will also be celebrated.

Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

St. Pio of Pietrelcina staff and students regularly engage in faith formation activities which include:

- Daily staff and student-led, school-wide prayer;
- Intentional and explicit inclusion of a distinctive Catholic world-view across all subject areas and as part of student inquiry;
- Adult Faith Ambassadors, leading staff liturgies at various times throughout the school year, in keeping with the liturgical calendar and needs of the school community, and weekly during Advent and Lent;
- A Faith Ambassador will attend the When Faith Meets Pedagogy Conference and share related resources with staff;
- Adult Faith Ambassadors sharing a plenary of faith based resources with staff monthly ("Faith Station" online), in keeping with the liturgical calendar and virtue focus of the month, for use in classrooms with students;
- Celebration of the virtues and other feast days of the liturgical calendar monthly, through student-led, school-wide liturgies;
- Viewing of ongoing updates/messages for students from Fr. Mario @Sts.Peter and Paul;
- Consistent modeling of Gospel values and faith practice;
- Invitation to parent community to join in liturgical celebrations;
- Prominent sacred spaces in all classrooms, in the front foyer, and throughout the school;

- School Mass @ Sts. Peter and Paul once a year and in the school three times a year;
- Youth Faith Ambassador Program, nurturing Catholic youth leadership through educational announcements with school-wide contests for engagement ("Faith Fridays"), artworks, liturgies and social justice based school-wide initiatives, on an ongoing basis throughout the year, in keeping with the liturgical calendar;
- Faith formation and knowledge building efforts include:
 - October: Christian Links to Halloween-Announcements;
 - November: "Faith Fridays": Saints;
 - December: Advent liturgies, "Faith Fridays": Advent;
 - January: "Faith Fridays": The Ten Commandments and the Virtue of Self-Control;
 - February: Black History Month liturgy, "Faith Fridays": Black Saints;
 - March: "Faith Fridays": Lent;
 - April: Eco-Liturgy, "Faith Friday's: Stewardship;
 - May: "Faith Fridays": The Rosary, Catholic Education Week announcements;
 - June: "Faith Fridays": The Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations;
- Active Eco-team focusing on stewardship of the Earth throughout the school year, through
 efforts to reduce lunch waste, "lights out" lunches, and promoting the use of reusable water
 bottles;

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

At St. Pio of Pietrelcina Catholic Elementary School, the Catholic Virtues are regularly referenced as part of our individual classroom commitments, as well as teachings. Virtues are meant to shape our approach to the world and guide us through both the successes and challenges that we may face throughout our lives. Our virtues are honoured through a variety of events and celebrations including:

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

At St. Pio of Pietrelcina C.E.S., our goal is to have our faith at the forefront of our daily teachings and interactions with all stakeholders. Our faith is present at the entrance of our school building with a statue of our patron saint, the Cross, the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations, and the Beatitudes. Objects, images, and words of our faith can be found throughout our hallways, including scripture verses, images of Jesus, images in keeping with the liturgical calendar, and our altar. Prayer centres can be found in every classroom. Faith-based activities and events are frequently organized, produced and experienced by the students in keeping with the liturgical calendar (i.e., the Stations of the Cross during Lent). Youth Faith Ambassadors seek to lead their peers in faith by sharing knowledge through announcements and posters, celebrating our faith through liturgies, and leading our school community in social justice efforts. Staff and students also come together to bring in donations of food, presents, personal needs items, for various drives throughout the year. (i.e., Food Drives, Angel Tree, Personal Needs Drives, ShareLife fundraising, etc.) and take great pride in having the ability to help others, in Jesus' name.
